Greetings to all members and friends of WCAIMH!

In July we had the pleasure of having **Katharine** Frost join us for our first virtual meeting of the year. Katharine presented a moving case of a mother and infant who's narrative was layered with the pain and complexity of trauma. Katharine offered her clinical insights and introduced theory to make sense of this mother-infant dyad. Most memorably, Katharine introduced us to the concept of the infant as a reanimator of a second way-of-being with a depressed mother. Some infants may extinguish their efforts with the depressed mother but for others they become a "sparkle-plenty", a life-giver or a charmer as was in the case presented. This can initially be seen a protective survival mechanism but has consequences for later in life. More about this concept can be found in The Motherhood Constellation: A Unified View of Parent-Infant **Psychotherapy** By Daniel N. Stern.

It was indeed a very enjoyable and informative talk!

We are delighted to invite you to our next virtual speaker evening. Our speaker will be **Hilary McLea**, a grief and trauma counsellor with a master's degree in social work. During this time of unanticipated change and unprecedented isolation, individuals, families and infants have been experiencing loss on a number of levels. Hilary's talk will focus on the **impact of loss on infants**, **young children**, **and their families**.

Hilary has experience of working with terminally ill patients and their families at St. Luke's Hospice for 18 years. She also spent eight years at a faith-based NPO developing and running workshops for those unable to pay for individual counselling. During her time with the NPO, she developed four manuals, one for mental health professionals, and the other three for those with limited education. 'Managing loss, grief and continuous trauma' uses the power of the group to facilitate healing. She has run multiple workshops in four provinces to train mental health professionals to run this workshop in their settings for both staff and clients. For the past twelve years Hilary has run a private practice from Claremont with individuals focusing on loss, grief, and continuous trauma. She is also a committee member of Western Cape branch of South African Association for Social Workers in Private Practice (SAASWIPP).
